Route I: Swallow's Wood and Cow Lane (via Devil's Bridge)

Starting on Green Lane, take the marked path between the houses on Meadowbank and Meadowbank Farm. Go over the stile and bear right around the back of the farm buildings.

Go through the gate on the left, and follow the path through the field. Continue over the stile and on along the path through the trees, over a small stream into an open meadow, until you reach the old beech trees with the entrance to the Swallow's Wood LNR on your right.

Enter the Reserve through the gate then join the main path and go left. Follow the path round, past the old building, through the trees and over the bridge. Stay on this path through the wood until you come down to the Victorian sluice gate.

Cross the bridge over the sluice gate and head up towards the pine trees. Go through the gate on your left and continue heading NW, keep left, until you can see the path down to the river on your left.

Cross over Devil's Bridge, heading back into the Nature Reserve. Stay straight ahead (signposted Hobson Moor) going up through the bracken until you come out into farmland. Stay left along the edge of the field. Details

Go over the stile and continue heading up the hill through the bracken in the direction of Hollingworth Hall. Go through the next two stiles and head up towards Hobson Moor Road keeping the wall on your left.

6 Leave the field via the stile on the left to adjoin Hobson Moor Road. Turn left, and follow the road until you reach the junction with Cow Lane.

Turn left into Cow Lane and continue down the hill until you return to your starting point, on Green Lane, Hollingworth.

Things to look out for on this walk

- * Butterflies in the meadow before the nature reserve.
- * Early Purple and Common Spotted Orchids around the entrance to the reserve and along the paths.
- * Firecrests and Goldcrests in the Gorse bushes in the reserve.
- Campion and Ox-eye Daisy along path edges within Swallow's Wood and Bluebells lining the woodland floor in spring.
- * Deer or their tracks near Devil's Bridge.
- Many different species of fungi in the wood and the fields near to Devil's Bridge.
- Pheasants and Grouse in the bracken to the North of the reserve.
- * Bats and birds in the wood on Cow Lane. The bypass will wreck the woodland that is home to many nocturnal animals and birds such as little owls, tawny owls and bats.
- * The fallen Beech tree in the bottom of the clough adjacent to Cow Lane.
- Blackberries lining the hedgerows along Cow Lane.
- Jays collecting acorns from the old oak trees on Cow Lane and surrounding fields.
- Wrens nesting along the banks on the edge of Cow Lane.


